

SIERRA MADRE POLICE BLOTTER

Week of June 18 – June 24, 2006

During the week of Sunday, June 18th, to Saturday June 24th, the Sierra Madre Police Department responded to approximately 189 calls for service. The following is a brief summary of a few of these calls, which the department handled during this period.

Sunday, June 18th:

5:12 PM – Annoying telephone calls, 200 block West Sierra Madre Blvd. A resident came to the station to report receiving unwanted telephone calls from an “ex” boyfriend. Officers were dispatched to the police station to conduct an investigation. The incident was documented with a report.

Monday, June 19th:

6:12 PM – Reported child abuse, 200 block West Sierra Madre Blvd. A resident came to the police station to report a possible child abuse of his daughter. An officer was dispatched to the station to document the incident. Officers conducted an investigation and documented the case with a crime report. The investigation revealed the reported abuse occurred in a neighboring city so the case was referred to the Department of Family and Children Services.

Tuesday, June 20th:

7:33 AM – Attempt suicide. The police department conducted a welfare check within the city regarding a reported suicide attempt. When officers arrived several residents were requested to evacuate due to a possible natural gas leak within the complex. The Sierra Madre Fire Department was requested and stood by until the residence was cleared. Sergeant Abbott successfully negotiated with the victim and the victim was taken to the hospital for evaluation.

Thursday, June 22nd:

9:10 AM – Auto burglary, 200 block East Sierra Madre Blvd. A resident called to report her car was broken into. Upon arrival officer conducted an investigation finding the one of the car windows smashed. The resident said items were missing from inside he car. The crime was documented with a report.

4:46 PM – Vandalism reported, 100 block East Grandview Ave. A resident called to report that someone put a dead opossum on the front seat of his car..

Saturday, June 24th:

2:34 PM – Identity theft, 1900 block Lilliano Drive. A resident came into the police station to report being the victim of identity theft. The resident reported receiving a notice from a creditor regarding an account opened without permission. Officer documented to crime with a report and the account was cancelled prior to any incurred loss.
