

SIERRA MADRE POLICE BLOTTER

Week of June 25 – July 1, 2006

During the week of Sunday, June 25th, to Saturday July 1st, the Sierra Madre Police Department responded to approximately 191 calls for service. The following is a brief summary of a few of these calls, which the department handled during this period.

Sunday, June 25th:

10:08 AM – Burglary report, 100 block Lowell Ave. A resident called to report the theft of drums and drum sticks from his home. Upon arrival the resident told the investigating officers he discovered the missing musical equipment on Saturday. Officers conducted a canvas of the neighborhood, finding a witness, who gave a possible suspect and a vehicle description. The loss was documented with a report.

Monday, June 26th:

1:07 PM – Vandalism report, 611 East Sierra Madre Blvd. A city employee called to report graffiti on a park bench and in the public restrooms at the park. Officers were dispatched to the park documenting damage with photographs and a written report.

Tuesday, June 27th:

12:00 PM – Auto Burglary, 700 block West Sierra Madre Blvd. A resident called to report the window of his truck was smashed and property taken. Officers were dispatched to the multi-unit complex to investigate. The stolen property was in a backpack, which the suspects stole by reaching through the smashed window thus preventing the alarm from activating. Officers documented the loss with a written report.

Wednesday, June 28th:

8:00 PM – Theft report, City of Sierra Madre. A resident came to the police station to report the loss of his backpack and unauthorized use of his ATM card. Officers were dispatched to the station and a loss report was filed. The victim told officers all he was intoxicated while attending a party in the Canyon, when the backpack was taken.

Thursday, June 29th:

5:40 PM – Suspicious circumstances, 00 block South Park Ave. A resident called to report a female adult lying face down in the front yard of his home. The Sierra Madre Fire Department was dispatched and officers were sent to investigate. Upon arrival officers found an intoxicated woman unresponsive. The woman was transported to the hospital for medical care and evaluation.

Saturday, July 1st:

7:31 PM – Vehicle stop, Santa Anita and Grandview Ave. Officers saw a truck with expired registration driving south on Santa Anita Ave, stopping the truck at the corner of Santa Anita, Foothill Blvd. Upon stopping the truck a records check of the driver revealed him to be unlicensed and that the truck's license registration tabs were false. The driver was arrested for the fraudulent registration and transported to the Pasadena Jail.
